Sandra Alvarez Daisson, Uruguayan refugees, arrested March 21 at the Ezeiza International Airport before boarding the plane that would have taken them to Sweden under the protection of the U.N. High Commission on Refugees.

Rodolfo Walsh, journalist and very well known writer, kidnapped March 24.

Juan Carlos Salomon, director newspaper La Provincia de Mendoza, detained April 1.

Edgardo Sajon, former press-secretary to President General Lanusse from 1971 to 1973; most recently he held the position of Assistant Editor to the well known Buenos Aires daily La Opinion. Kidnapped April 1.

Hector Ferreiros, formerly a Catholic priest, became journalist and had been working for TELAM News Agency at the time of his disappearance April 1. On April 5, his bullet-riddled body was found in Monte Grande, a few miles southeast of Buenos Aires.

Eduards Dutcharsky, Independent reporter, 25 years old, active member of the Argentine League for Human Rights. Kidnapped April 1.

Jorge Kreynes, 29 years old, active member of the Argentine League for Human Rights, kidnapped April 1.

Roberto Antonio Di Vita, 29 years old, active member of the Argentine -League for Human Rights, kidnapped April 1.

Adolfo Perez Esquivel, peace advocate, Coordinator and Argentine Representative to the Latin American Peace and Justice Service, arrested April 5.

<u>Gustavo Carballo</u>, lawyer, former Technical Secretary to the Peronist government; he was defending Jose Gelbard's extradition case. Disappeared April 6.

Juan Carlos Rousselot, former press secretary of the Secretary of Welfare during the Peronist government. Director of newspaper Norte, accused of subversion for articles published in his newspaper, arrested April 6.

Claudio Augusto Levitan, kidnapped April 6, his disappearance was reported by his parents, both lawyers.

Mariano Montemayor, journalist, very well known political commentator,



kidnapped April 11.

Hipolito Jesus Paz, lawyer, former minister of Foreign Relations during the Peronist government, kidnapped April 11.

Miguel de Anchorena, lawyer, kidnapped April 11.

Jorge Rubinstein, lawyer, kidnapped and found dead April 12.

Father Carlos Bustos, priest, kidnapped April 12.

Isidoro Graiver, kidnapped last February and arrested April 14, accused of complicity with subversion.

Lidia Papleo de Graiver, arrested April 14, accused of complicity with subversion.

Silvia Fanjul, arrested April 14, accused of complicity with subversion.

Lidia Gesualdi, same as above.

Juan Graiver, same as above.

Jacobo Timmerman, director La Opinion, 53 years old, arrested April 15.

Enrique Jara, news editor <u>La Opinion</u>, arrested together with Timmerman on April 15, authorities denied his detention for 2 days and later acknowled-ged it.

Francisco Fernandez Bernardez, arrested April 16.

Enrique Raab, very well known journalist, kidnapped April 16.

Rafael lanover, arrested April 18, accused of complicity with subversion.

Orlando Reynoso, same as above.

Dante Marra, same as above.

Julio Daich, same as above.

Flora Dybner de Ravel, same as above.

Martin Aberg Cobo, same as above.

Jorge Rodriguez, same as above.

Ricardo Perera, same as above.

Ernesto de Estrada, same as above.

Ricardo Bertoldi, same as above.

Robert Cox, Editor Buenos Aires Herald and correspondent to the Washington Post and The Christian Science Monitor, accused of collaboration with subversion for his statements on human rights violations in Argentina; arrested April 22.



CHRONOLOGY OF KILLINGS IN ARGENTINA FROM MARCH 20 TO APRIL 24, 1977

Sources: Agence France Press and Washington Post. (Note: It should be noted that in the official dispatches no names of the casualties are provided and that no government casualties are reported in the alleged "confrontations".

- March 23.- 2 bodies were found dead in an empty lot southeast of Buenos Aires.
- March 24.- 4 people were killed in alleged confrontation with government forces.
- April 6.- 12 people were killed in alleged confrontations with government forces.
- April 7.- 5 people were killed under same circumstances as above.
- April 13.- 4 people were killed under same circumstances as above.
- April 14.- 2 bodies were found dead with cement blocks tied to their waists in the province of Corrientes.
- April 19.- 2 bodies showing marks of torture were found dead north of Buenos Aires.
- April 20.- 8 people were reported killed in alleged clashes with government forces in different areas of Buenos Aires province.
- April 23.- 10 people were reported killed under similar circumstances.
