Thank Mammy first for the letter she sent and the money enclosed. This week I'm very busy as we're having a Youth-Week here & it involves a lot of work. Next week I hope to take a day off to write letters (thank you people for the money they've given me. And also write to the Ries of Limerick.)

I'm inclosing 2 slides - One was taken in Corktown around April - it was a walk we done with a Legion of Mary-type group to in the country here - You can see us having the lunch - With the same group of people we're organising the youth week here. Most are University or secondary school students. The other photo was taken during Lent when 2 of us went fishing in the river here. The water of the river is salted off and for that no vegetation grows on the banks - It was about 11.0 in the morning when ~~we~~ he took the photo. The sky here is mostly blue like that. I didn't come out two well because of the sun. About 2 hrs. later the owner of the farm came & and hunted us ... → we weren't supposed to be there!

I don't have much more news. Received a letter from Margaret Norman - They all seem well - The collar-bone is healing up well.
